## **ORDER:**

The Hon'ble Minister (Fisheries-Fishermen Welfare and Animal Husbandry) in the budget session for the year 2022-23 while moving the demand of Animal Husbandry, Dairying, Fisheries and Fishermen Welfare Department, on 13.04.2022 has made the following announcement on the floor of the assembly.

In the letter read above, the Commissioner of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services has stated that 100% central assistance of Rs.39.20 crore towards Non-Recurring expenditure for the above scheme has been received from Government of India by Tamil Nadu Livestock Development Agency (TNLDA) under National Animal Disease Control Programme (NADCP) account under the sub component of Livestock and Health Disease control scheme and will be utilized for the purchase of customized mobile van, vehicle for providing veterinary health care fully equipped with equipment for diagnosis, treatment, surveillance sample collection, for performing minor surgery as well as for audio visual aids for extension activities as per the guidelines prescribed by the Government of India.

## ANNEXURE-II

### Operational Guidelines for Mobile Veterinary Units

#### **I. Fixed route:**

- The Assistant Director of Animal Husbandry will prepare regular route schedule along with a monthly health camp schedule for conducting camps in consultation with all the Veterinary Assistant Surgeons working in the block for effective functioning of the MVU.
- This programme schedule for each month has to be approved by Regional Joint Director of Animal Husbandry.
- Each MVU will operate for 25 days in a month and conduct one camp covering at least two villages per day from Monday to Saturday as per the monthly health camp schedule.
- The camps shall be programmed in such a manner so as to provide "Fixed day - Fixed time" veterinary services to the villages.
- The camps shall be selected in villages that are remote and located in very far off places.
- The list of the villages may be changed on need basis/rotational basis.
- Fixed day - Fixed time will be intimated to all concerned villages well in advance.
- Care should be taken to maintain regularity in these camps as per the schedule.
- Medicines and equipment necessary for the MVUs will be supplied by the department and breeding inputs for AI will be provided through cattle Breeding and Fodder Development (CBFD) units at district level.
- The Nodal Officer must ensure that the MVU is provided with the necessary inputs for their effective functioning.

#### **Roles and Responsibilities of concerned veterinary officer engaged for MVU:**

The Veterinary officer (i/c) of the MVU should submit the following report to the concerned nodal officer ADAH daily.

- Date wise performance details shall be maintained in a register on given heads.
- Name of the villages covered
- Name of the livestock owner
- Tentative diagnosis of ailments and medicine given

- Particulars of examinations conducted if any
- Any peculiar matter on livestock worth reporting
- List and quantity of medicines spent on the particular camp

The registers of works carried out by each MVU shall be presented to the ADAH counter signature on every Saturday. Wide publicity should be made to create public awareness of the availability of services by the concerned ADAH/RJDAH.

**The operational plan – Monthly work plan**

Other activities like attending to emergencies, outbreaks, vaccination and camps organized by the Department	As and when necessary	As and when reported in the same block.

**II. Attending Emergency cases received from the call centre:**

The MVUs will provide veterinary services at the Farmer’s doorstep basis through the phone call received at the call centre from farmers of respective state ADAH of the Division shall be the Nodal Officer for the operations of the MVUs under their Jurisdiction.

A state level call centre will be aligned with the existing call centre of the state. Such call centre will be under the control of the state Animal Husbandry Department with a nodal Officer nominated by the state. It will receive calls from livestock rearers / animal owners and transmit them to the veterinarian at the call centre.

The decision of directing the MVU would be on the emergent nature of the veterinary case as decide by the veterinarian at the call centre. The call centre will be responsible for monitoring the movement and use of the MVUs. The call centre should also confirm actual services through the mobile number of the animal owner and share the data with the state. The call centre will be responsible for communication with the nearby veterinary surgeon for follow up treatment and registered local Artificial Insemination technician for Artificial Insemination.
